



Vision Screening Information:

Thank you for allowing your child or children to participate in the Multiple District 5M Lions KidSight Vision Screening program.

This screening **does not** replace a complete vision exam by an eye care professional. During the screening we screen for the following conditions:

Anisometropia: This means that the two eyes have a different refractive power, so there is unequal focus between the two eyes. This could be an indicator of Amblyopia or “Lazy Eye”

Astigmatism: is a refractive error caused by an abnormality in the curvature of the cornea and/or the lens.

Hyperopia: Farsightedness, difficulty seeing objects up close.

Myopia: Nearsightedness, difficulty see objects at a distance.

Gaze asymmetry: Potential muscle imbalance or misalignment of the eyes also known as strabismus. This condition can also be an indicator of Amblyopia or “Lazy Eye”

Anisocoria: refers to pupils that are different sizes at the same time. The presence of anisocoria can be normal, or it can be a sign of an underlying medical condition.

Only a complete vision exam by an eye care professional can determine if your child has the condition(s) identified in the screening process.

We encourage you to make an appointment with an eye care professional as soon as possible if you child has one or more of these conditions listed on their screening result form.

If your child’s screening did not result in a referral, we would encourage you to have your child’s vision screened on a regular basis.
